2011 Creative Arts General Rules & Regulations

1. Any youth or adult who resides in Wharton County is eligible to enter one of the following age divisions:
(All 4-H exhibitors must be enrolled in 4-H by November 1, 2010)
 - a. Junior 4-H, FCCLA & FFA (age 8 and in 3rd grade); ages 9 yrs. old through 10 yrs. old as of August 31, 2010 (All 4-H Clover Kids must enter Jr. Open Youth Division)
 - b. Intermediate 4-H, FCCLA & FFA ages 11 yrs. old through 13 yrs. old as of August 31, 2010.
 - c. Senior 4-H, FCCLA & FFA, ages 14 yrs. old through 18 yrs. old as of August 31, 2010.
 - d. All youth enrolled in a 4-H club or FCCLA/FFA Chapter must enter through that club or chapter, not as Open Youth.
 - e. All other youth, not enrolled in 4-H, FCCLA or FFA, referred to as Open Youth. Junior (ages 5-10 years) Intermediate (ages 11-13 years) and Senior (ages 14 -18 years). (**Exception:** see Art Section for ages 4 and under).
 - f. Adult
2. All school age exhibitors must meet the following scholastic criteria:
 - a. Must be enrolled in a Primary, Secondary, or Home School in Wharton County. (Wharton County Junior College students age 19 must be actively enrolled in 4-H)
 - b. Must comply with the “**No Pass, No Play**” rule as dictated by **UIL** eligibility requirements, excluding kindergarten and younger.
 - c. Required to prove scholastic eligibility at check-in with an eligibility certificate, provided by Wharton County Youth Fair and signed by the principal. The eligibility certificates will be mailed with entry tags after entry forms have been processed.
3. “Entry” eligibility requirements are as follows:
 - a. Only those articles listed in the **2011 Rulebook** (classes) are eligible to be entered.
 - b. Only one entry per class is allowed.**
 - c. Items may be entered as “Any other” only if they do not qualify in listed classes.
 - d. Only those articles created- made by the exhibitor are eligible to be entered.
 - e. All articles must have been made since last year’s Wharton County Youth Fair. (With the exceptions of quilt tops made into quilts)**
 - f. An entry will be disqualified prior to judging for any of the following infractions:
 1. The entry/article is not clean.
 2. A canned product entry is not sealed.
 3. An entry/article has been entered in the wrong class.
 4. An article is not finished and ready for use, excluding quilt tops (Sec 9 D Class 965).
 - g. The Executive Committee reserves the right to disqualify a questionable entry/article.
4. Exhibitor’s “entry” specifications:
 - a. Exhibitor is required to enter articles on the official entry form provided by the Wharton County Youth Fair. (See example for detailed instructions.)

- b. Entry forms and rulebooks are available on the website at www.whartoncountyyouthfair.org or by calling the fair office.
 - c. Open Youth exhibitors may enter up to, but not more than, **50 articles** on their entry forms (including art entries).
 - d. Junior and Intermediate 4-H, FCCLA or FFA exhibitors, including those trying for **High Point Winner**, may enter up to, but not more than, **50 articles** on their entry form(including art entries).Those trying for High Point Winner must bring at least **25 articles. Art entry points will go towards High Point Award.**
 - e. Senior 4-H, FCCLA or FFA exhibitors, including those trying for **High Point Winner**, may enter up to, but not more than, **60 articles** on their entry form (including art entries). Those trying for High Point Winner must bring at least **30 articles. Art entry points will go towards High Point Award.**
 - f. Adult exhibitors, including those trying for **High Point Winner**, may enter up to, but not more than, **60 articles** on their entry form and must bring at least **30 articles.**
5. The following exhibitor “entry” fees must accompany the entry forms:
- a. Kindergarten and younger----No entry fee.
 - b. Per exhibitor-----One (1) to Nine (9) articles, \$5.00 entry fee.
 - c. Per exhibitor-----Ten (10) to thirty (30) articles, \$10.00 entry fee.
 - d. Per exhibitor-----Thirty-one (31) to sixty (60) articles, \$15.00 entry fee.

6. **DEADLINE** to enter is **Tuesday, February 1, 2011** forms must be received in the Fair Office by **4:00 p.m.** Or postmarked by **February 1, 2011.**

7. Check-in Schedule and Requirements:
- a. Thursday, April 28, 2011 – **3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.** (all entries).
 - b. Entry tags must be completed prior to check-in. These tags will be provided to exhibitors by the Wharton County Youth Fair. (See page 6 for detailed instructions.)
8. Check-out Schedule and Requirements:
- a. Friday, May 6, 2011– **3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.** Entry tag stubs will be required for the release of exhibitors’ articles. (Exhibitors may make arrangements for someone other than themselves to pick up articles.)
 - b. **All articles must be checked out and cleared with a committee member on Friday, May 6, 2011 by 5:00 p.m. for any articles left after this time, the exhibitors must make arrangements with the Creative Arts Executive Committee and pay a \$25.00 late fee within one week of check-out day in order to pick up their articles. Any articles left after this time will be disposed of by the WCYF.**
9. ***Premium money will be paid to exhibitors during checkout hours May 6, 2011, 3-5 p.m. Any exhibitor(s) who did not pick up articles during official checkout time will forfeit their premium money.***

ARMBANDS, AWARDS, HIGH POINT & PREMIUM INFORMATION

JUDGING: Judging will begin at 9:30 a.m., Friday, April 29, 2011.

ARMBAND ELIGIBILITY: Any youth exhibitor 6 years of age and older who has 15 or more articles accepted for competition at check-in will receive an armband. An armband will allow youth exhibitors onto the Fairgrounds during Fair week, and will also allow them to participate in the Awards Banquet to be held Friday, May 6, 2011, 6:00 p.m.

RIBBON POINT AWARDS: Points apply only to Jr., Inter. and Sr. 4-H, FCCLA & FFA divisions; and Adult division. Open youth exhibitors do not receive point values for ribbons.

HIGH POINT AWARDS: After calculating total points for each entry in each section, per exhibitor, the top two winners in the Jr., Inter. and Sr.4-H, FCCLA and FFA divisions will be declared High Point and Reserve High Point. In case of ties, winners will be determined in the following manner: 1) Number of Purple Rosettes, 2) Number of Pink Rosettes, 3) Total number of blue ribbons, 4) Number of blue ribbons in the section(s) randomly drawn by the Executive Committee. Names of winners will be posted by noon on Sunday, May 1st. **Please do not call the Fair Office for results.** The Jr., Int. and Sr. High Point and Reserve High Point winners are eligible to sell in the Sale of Excellence, but not required if they have a livestock/poultry entry they would prefer to sell. The 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, etc. place winners that meet requirements in each division will have the option to move into the Sale of Excellence should this occur. **It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the Main Office as to which article/animal is to be sold. The deadline for scratching is one hour after the results of the last market show are posted.** The six exhibitors who sell in the Sale of Excellence will be required to pick up final buyer information on Sunday, May 8, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at WCYF Office. The top three Adult division winners will be declared after calculating total points for entries in each section per exhibitor.

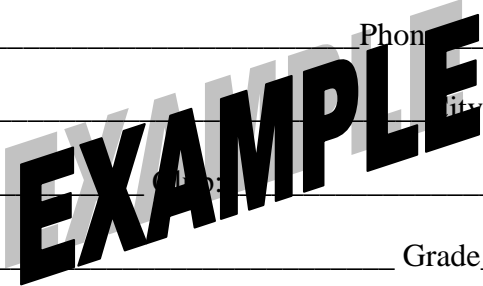

1. Exhibitors are to print full names and complete mailing addresses, including zip codes. Only youth are required to include age and club name. Entry form submitted must be completely and correctly filled out to be eligible to enter and **MUST** be signed by Exhibitor.
2. Only one age division is to be checked. Age divisions are as of August 31, 2010.
3. All entries must be circled on the entry form.
4. **Only one entry per Class number will be accepted.**
5. Signatures of FFA/FCCLA Advisor, Art teacher, 4-H Club Manager, Extension Agent or Parent, and Exhibitors are required on each entry form submitted. Date on entry form must be included.
6. The entry fee must accompany entry form.

1. Official entry tags (colored-coded according to age division) will be mailed to exhibitors after all entry forms have been received, but not before the deadline date.
2. Exhibitors should **print** when filling out entry tag(s), one tag per Class Number. (Obtained from rulebook) Tags must be completely and accurately filled out and attached to article prior to check-in. Exhibitors should tear the stub portion off prior to check-in and write the name of the article on the stub for easier identification at check-out.
3. Jr., Int. and Sr. 4-H, FCCLA, FFA and Open Youth Creative Arts Division exhibitors, and Adult Division exhibitors will be assigned an exhibitor number and notified of the exhibitor number when entry tags are mailed. Participants in these divisions are required to print their exhibitor number on the entry tags.
4. All exhibitors, excluding Adults, must include on entry tag age as of August 31, 2010 of current school year.
5. Entry tags must be folded forward up to the dotted line so that exhibitor name is not exposed and stapled in the middle of folded portion. **(Tape should not be used.)**
6. Entry tags should be secured to articles with string, rubber bands, safety pins, tape or staples. **Exhibitors should not staple entry tag to inside of plastic zipper bag when entering baked products.**
7. Every exhibitor will be required to bring his/her entry tag stubs for check-out.

ALL AGE DIVISIONS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER (Jr., Int., Sr., Adult, Open Youth Division ages 5 yrs. thru 18 yrs. as of August 31, 2010).

Rules that apply to these Sections only:

1. All canned products entered in Sections 5A, 5B, and 5C must be in standard jars—pint or quart only.
2. All canned products entered in Section 5D must be in standard 4-oz., 8-oz., 12-oz., pint or quart jars.
3. Canned products will be disqualified if exhibited in mayonnaise, coffee, or any other jar that is not a standard canning jar.
4. All canned product jars must be clean and unchipped with new lids and rings. (Slight rust on rings will be accepted.)
5. All canned products must be sealed with only one lid. The use of paraffin or decorative lid coverings is prohibited.
6. Most canned products require ½ inch headspace.
7. Quality canned items do not have air pockets(bubbles)among the product pieces.
8. All canned products must have a good color and the liquid should be clean, not cloudy, suitable for item canned, and must cover the product.
9. Entry tag must be attached with string or rubber band to the neck of the jar.
10. Most Outstanding and Runner-Up Rosettes will be awarded in Sections 5A, 5B, 5C and 5D in all age divisions.

ALL AGE DIVISIONS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER (Jr., Int., Sr., Adult, Open Youth Division ages 5 yrs. thru 18 yrs. as of August 31, 2010)

Rules that apply to these Sections only:

1. Baked products (cakes, pies, strudels, breads (except cornbread]) must be brought **whole** and in/on disposable containers (paper, cardboard or foil **only**, **NO bakery boxes, glass or metal containers**). All other baked products and candies must be on a 6" or 7" **white** plate and in a 1-quart plastic zipper bag. All items not in self-sealing bags must be covered.
2. No baked products or candies that require refrigeration will be accepted including cream cheese frosting.
3. Decorated cookies must be iced and decorated. Cookies in other classes with colored sugar, candy or icing will be accepted.
4. **No mixes, canned, refrigerated or purchased items including pie crust may be entered, with the exception of altered cake(sec 6D, Class 620) All baked products must be made from scratch.**
5. No decorated cakes or cupcakes may be entered in Section 6D; cupcakes with icing, colored sugar or candy will be accepted.
6. All baked products, with the exception of those on display, will be donated to the Wharton County Youth Fair.
7. Most Outstanding and Runner-Up Rosettes will be awarded in Sections 6A, 6B, 6C, 6D, 6E and 6F.
